The Significance of Emotional Intelligence (EQ) for Leaders and Practitioners

Emotional intelligence may not be something that you are intrinsically aware of as leaders and career development practitioners (CDPs). EQ is defined as the ability to understand and manage your emotions, as well as recognize and influence the emotions of those around you. It is the ability in positive ways to communicate effectively, empathize with others, overcome challenges, and diffuse conflict. EQ may be measured by how well we understand and comprehend our emotions as leaders and practitioners and those of others coupled with our responses to those emotions. In other words, being present, supportive, and available for those for whom we are responsible in the field of career development.
